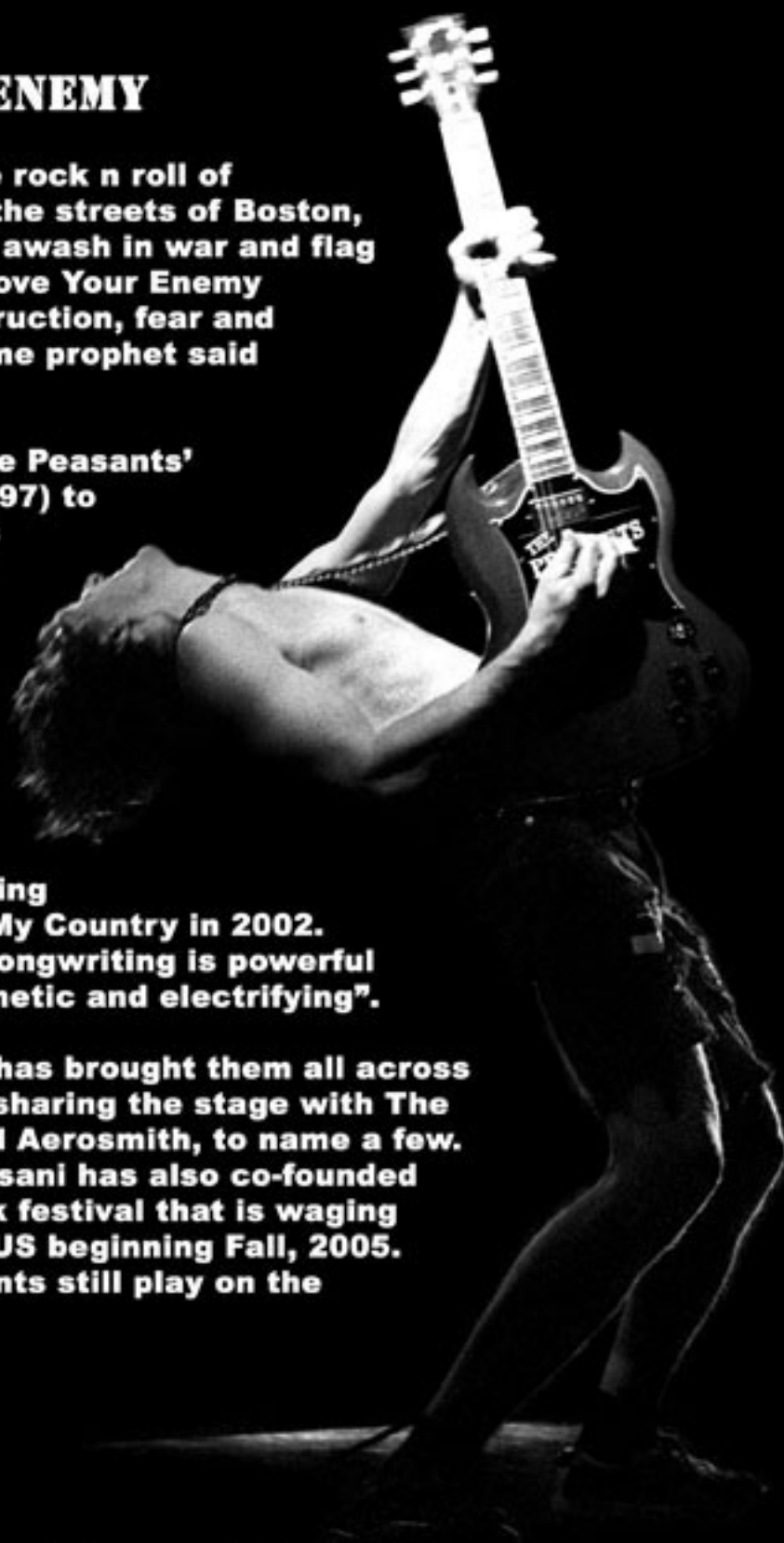
LOVE YOUR ENEMY

Welcome to the rebellious garage rock n roll of The Peasants, a band formed on the streets of Boston, Massachusetts. With the country awash in war and flag waving, The Peasants' third CD Love Your Enemy documents our descent into destruction, fear and hate while reminding us what some prophet said over 2000 years ago.

Over 250 radio stations added The Peasants' first record Out On the Street (1997) to their playlists within weeks of its release. It was acclaimed by the College Music Journal (CMJ) as "rip-roaring garage rock... in the spirit of boozy era Paul Westerberg".

When offers came from Europe, The Peasants took flight to Holland (Suburban Records) and Germany (Cargo Records), releasing their second record Welcome to My Country in 2002. CMJ noted that "Pete Cassani's songwriting is powerful and his guitar playing is mad, frenetic and electrifying".

The Peasants' relentless touring has brought them all across the US and five times to Europe, sharing the stage with The White Stripes, The Stray Cats and Aerosmith, to name a few. The Peasants' frontman Pete Cassani has also co-founded The Love Your Enemy Tour, a rock festival that is waging peace through music across the US beginning Fall, 2005. When not on the road, The Peasants still play on the streets.
